





Map of Strict Baptist churches, 1917

"I have obtained exemption from any form of military service as a Strict Baptist Minister. I was asked to show proof, and took the Christian's Pathway for November 1913, 1914, 1915, and was granted

complete exemption at once."

He produced the List of *Ministers' Names and Addresses*, which we publish annually in November, and this constituted undeniable evidence that he is a recognised Strict and Particular Baptist Minister.




Military service exemption, 1918






